- New York State residents age 50 and older.
- EMS workers.

- Home care workers and aides.
- Hospice workers.
- Personal care aides.
- Consumer-directed personal care workers.
- Staff and residents of nursing homes, skilled nursing facilities, and adult care facilities.
- Police, fire, public safety, and corrections officers.
- Pre-K-12 teachers.
- In-person college faculty and instructors.
- Childcare providers.
- Public transit employees.
- Grocery store workers.
- Incarcerated people age 50 and older.
- People living or working in a homeless shelter.
- Restaurant employees and delivery workers.
- For-hire vehicle drivers.
- People with health conditions.
- People with intellectual or developmental disabilities.
- Public-serving government and public employees.
- Public-serving not-for-profit workers.
- Essential in-person, public- building service workers and providers of essential building services.

COVID-19 vaccination is currently taking place. Although there are limited amounts of vaccine available for New Yorkers, the state will continue to receive vaccine from the federal government on a rolling basis.
